The Fund's objective is to achieve a total return greater than that of the NSCI (XIC) over the long term by investing in a diversified portfolio of small UK quoted companies.


## **Investment style: Value**

Aberforth are value investors who buy shares in companies that they calculate to be selling below their intrinsic value. This is determined through detailed financial and industrial analysis, combined with a valuation approach that focuses on both stockmarket and corporate worth.

# Monthly investment commentary: July

Most equity markets rose during the month, responding to a large EU stimulus package alongside improving economic data. The FTSE All-Share fell by 3.6%, hindered by its exposure to oil & gas and banks. Less encumbered in this respect, the NSCI (XIC) gained 1.2%. The Fund's return was -4.2%. Style was the most significant influence on the under-performance. Despite tentative signs of a rotation to value in late May and early June, value trailed growth in July. Size offered no mitigation since the "smaller smalls", presently favoured by the Fund, trailed the larger constituents of the NSCI (XIC).

Turning to stocks, amid the market's enthusiasm for growth companies, Kainos, S4 Capital, Integrafin and Pets at Home all performed especially well and detracted from the relative return. Among the holdings, Premier Oil was weak. Despite reiterating production guidance, focus was on its acquisition of BP assets and the associated equity raise and refinancing. Meanwhile, bus and rail operator FirstGroup fell in response to results and news publisher Reach fell in the wake of a trading update. Elsewhere, brick manufacturer Forterra performed poorly following a 14% equity placing. More generally, equity issues from companies affected by the Covid-19 recession are expected to continue through the third quarter, with August likely to be busy as many companies announce their results.


More positively, CMC Markets and inkjet printing technology group Xaar responded well to robust trading updates.


The dealing spread shown in the Fees & charges section is the difference between the Issue and Cancellation prices and reflects the underlying spread on the Fund's portfolio.

### **Data sources & calculations**

All data supplied by Aberforth, except NSCI (XIC) data (from Numis/Paul Marsh and Elroy Dimson – London Business School) and FTSE data (from FTSE International Limited).

Performance returns are total returns after all expenses and assume reinvestment of dividends. Yield is based on the Fund's trailing 12 months' dividends. Active share is a measure of how the Fund's portfolio differs from the NSCI (XIC). Small companies are represented by the NSCI (XIC). Large companies are represented by the FTAS.
